

REVELATIONS

The English word Revelation is have been translated and accepted as a word meaning apocalypse.

The word in Revalations is in fact to unveil or reveal something that will be transformed. It speaks of a time to be transformed and be prepared. Revelations points back to several books in the Scriptures, revealing the time to come.

Revelation is a firm connection between the New Testament Book of Revelation and in between several Old Testament books is needed for proper interpretation of Revelation.

We already have fundamental proof that of this needed who the Messiah is. He was Yeshua of Nazareth the fulfillment of a number of Old Testament prophecies,, He is the son of YHVH and the son of man. He was, he is and he will be back in the time of Revelation. HalleluYah

We will find several interpretations all over social media and various levels of explanations.

When we earnestly pray, YHVH will send His Spirit to open our minds to His word. The lesson of Revelation start from beginning to end. As we see the scroll unfolding before our eyes, there will be a great unveiling and transformation and understanding as the Spirit of YHVH presence will help us discover the message we need to receive.

By drawing ourself towards a remarkable section of the Book of Revelations we also find in 1 Corinthians, Paul makes an indelible connection between the Old Testament and the times that the New Testament authors lived in. Paul made mention about when it was that he thought that the current age would come to a close. First let us discover who Paul is.

Paul was firstly known as "Saul". Paul's family were from the tribe of Benjamin. His birthplace, Tarsus, was a major city in eastern Cilicia, a region that had became part of the Roman empire of Syria in the time of Paul's adulthood. The Hebrew name is (בֶּתֶר אֲרָם צוֹבָא) Keter Aram Tzova, translated as "Crown of Aleppo" was identified as the biblical city in Syria. Two of the main cities of Syria, Damascus and Antioch, played a prominent part in Pauls life as he referred to it in his letters. Paul claimed he was separated from his mother's womb for service to YHVH. The epistles (letters) of Paul have had enormous influence in the Messianic era, especially concerning the relationship between YHVH the Heavenly Father of Yeshua, and the human relationship with the most divine. He was definitely a devout Jew, and among those who persecuted the early followers of Yeshua.

The Apostle Paul (Saul) felt the same way; he referred to himself on four different levels from highest to lowest.

Paul attended Stephen's stoning in Acts 7:58. Paul recognized the depths of his own sinful nature and therefore describes himself as "the worst of sinners" (I Timothy 1:13-15). In describing YHVH's glorious plan for all of those who love Him, Paul gives divine descriptions of us being filled even with "the fullness of Elohim" (Ephesians 3:19). Just like the appointed desciples, Paul suffered severely for spreading and infiltration of the Messianic faith to the world.

In describing YHVH 's grace towards us in salvation and the forgiveness of sins, we need to grasp the greatness of Yeshua's sacrifice for us on the cross despite our own unworthiness. In deep repentance for our sins, Paul recognizes our sinful nature and found it important that we see the love of YHVH. YHVH's grace grants to us way to His supernatural through Yeshua HaMashiach. The purpose and significance is that YHVH planned a destiny far beyond the level or capacity of what we can even image. Yet our own frailty and lack of ability lead us to the painful awareness of our own unworthiness and selfishness outside of YHVH's Amazing grace. YHVH's intention, that every person experiences a change of heart towards him.

The Holy Spirit equipped Paul with all the necessary teaching in the Messianic faith. the Roman government treated Christianity as a sect of Judaism

The Book of Revelation, which is mostly about the End Times, is also about the fulfillment of the purposes and prophecies of the Old Testament.

As we read the words of Revelation, we shall see that without the beginning and all that is inbetween we cannot understand the end times. End times revealed to us the everlasting life and that YHVH will make an end to all that is a abomination in His eyes.

Paul directly connected the Old Testament with the End Times teaching that the End Times **is** the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies. YHVH's Mercy endures forever and therefore we find the following verse as a reminder.

Romans 5:8

But YHVH demonstrates His own love for us in this, While we were still sinners Yeshua died for us.

Yeshua HaMashiach taught us to pray "Let Thy Kingdom come and will be done on earth as in heaven".

Psalm 34:22

YHVH redeems the soul of His servants, And none of those who take refuge in Him will be condemned.

Romans 8:1

Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Yeshua HaMashiach.

We can turn to 2 Timothy 3 and will find great unveiling information that helps us spiritual in our understanding.

2 Timothy 3:1-10

But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of YHVH, having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away! For of this sort are those who creep into households and make captives of gullible women loaded down with sins, led away by various lusts, always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth. Now as Yannes and Yambres resisted Moshe, so do these also resist the truth: men of corrupt minds, disapproved concerning the faith; but they will progress no further, for their folly will be manifest to all, as theirs also was.

2 Timothy 3:10-17

But you have carefully followed my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love,

perseverance, persecutions, afflictions, which happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra what persecutions I endured. And out of them all Adonai delivered me. Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Yeshua HaMashiach will suffer persecution. But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived.

But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them, and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Yeshua HaMashiach.

All Scripture is given by inspiration of YHVH, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of YHVH may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

As in the book of Timothy, Paul refers to in 1 Corinthians 10: the Old Testament. Without the help and context of the Old Testament and the presence of the Holy Spirit in our midst, understanding it is hopeless.

1 Corinthians 10:1-12

For, brothers, I don't want you to miss the significance of what happened to our fathers. All of them were guided by the pillar of cloud, and they all passed through the sea, and in connection with the cloud and with the sea they all immersed themselves into Moshe, also they all ate the same food from the Spirit, and they all drank the same drink from the Spirit-for they drank from a Spirit-sent Rock which followed them, and that Rock was the Messiah. Yet with the majority of them YHVH was not pleased, so their bodies were strewn across the desert.

Now these things took place as prefigurative historical events, warning us not to set our hearts on evil things as they

did. Don't be idolaters, as some of them were- as the Tanakh puts it, "The people sat down to eat and drink, then got up to indulge in revelry." And let us not engage in sexual immorality, as some of them did, with the consequence that 23,000 died in a single day. And let us not put the Messiah to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by snakes. And don't grumble, as some of them did, and were destroyed by the Destroying Angel.

These things happened to them as prefigurative historical events, and they were written down as a warning to us who are living in the acharit-hayamim. Therefore, let anyone who thinks he is standing up be careful not to fall!

Korah being about 23000, were killed for rebelling against YHVH and Moshe. We find the Scriptures refers to 24,000. "Those who died by the plague were 24,000.", "and in one day 23,000 of them died." It follows, therefore, that, consequent to being struck by YHVH, 23,000 people died in one day, and 1,000 people died in days following.

As Pharaoh hardened his heart and the people of Egypt did not change their ways, YHVH gave them pre-warning to be prepared for what shall pass over the land. The disobedience and serving Paganism, led to the plagues.

YHVH appointed several prophets to prophesy and give the message to the people. YHVH warned to get out of the impurity, corruption, paganism and sexual immorality in this world.

We should not supporting it, promoting it or even partake in it but be prepared for the end is near.

The Hebrew word *Acharit-hayammim* is translated into English in most Bibles as "the end of the age". An alternative term we use is *The End Times*. Paul says those things written about what happened to "our fathers", things recorded in the Old Testament, were recorded as a warning "to us who are living in the end of the age".

Paul thought the time was upon him; he was not waiting for the End Times to eventually come; he was certain that he was living in the End Times.

Yeshua would return momentarily, the world as Paul knew it would end, and a new age would be ushered in with Yeshua as an earthly King during Paul's lifetime.

As as ready ourselves to open this the final book of the Bible, the final recorded historical words that will ever be given to the worldwide Body of Believers by means of divine oracle and inspiration, let us not be terribly rigid in how we take them. Much of the book is about a future filled with mystery; and as those many Jews just prior to the birth of Yeshua could attest if they were still living, religious doctrines and manmade traditions and our own personal interpretations of as yet unrealized prophesied events in the Bible must be held lightly or we're liable to miss out recognizing the actual events for what they are when they finally do happen.

Open your Bibles to the Book of Revelation chapter 1.

The first few words of Revelation verse 1 are crucial as well as not just a bit controversial. The crucial part is that the words of Revelation are characterized as more than divinely inspired; they are divinely given.

Since "Christians" tend to be primarily focused on the New Testament, then the level to which divine authority can be attached to those 27 books is important to determine.

The New Testament is of a class of authority called "divinely inspired". In contrast meaning that while the words of the New Testament were spiritually given, and written down by, prophesy, it is divinely influenced in a Supernatural way to record them in writing for those in living to discover the truth in it.

Matthew 4:4

But he answered and said, It is. written, Man shall not live by. bread alone, but by every word that. proceeded out of the mouth of YHVH.

Our lives are not based on living by eating, but every day is a gift of Grace an Mercy, living by the words written and breathed out by YHVH.

Word directly spoken by Messiah Yeshua are direct divine words and instructions given for human meditation and meditation.

The words of Yeshua HaMashiach rise to a higher level of divinely inspired and authority given by YHVH.

The words of Revelation are essentially in the same category as the direct words of Yeshua because we are told unequivocally that "this is the revelation that YHVH gave to Yeshua the Messiah" and were passed along.

The writers of the Old Testament and New Testament are given direct divine oracles; and are not passing along their own thoughts. They are in the sense messengers of YHVH's ordinances and directives.

What we find is that YHVH is the Oracle author who gives the visions and revelation. Opening the eyes of the blind and healing them by His Truth, making way to the Kingdom by acceptance through forgiveness.

The oracles and visions begin with YHVH the Creator and Father by His Holy Spirit. The Oracle is passed along to angels of YHVH, to Moshe, and the prophets to appear before the people.

YHVH's Oracle to His son Yeshua, the Messiah was that YHVH will Redeem the people. The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit works together as one. There is a very clear delineation that Scriptures teach between YHVH and Yeshua the Messiah. YHVH gave His only begotten son Yeshua as a living sacrifice for the sins of the world.

In both Testaments when the term (GOD or LORD) is used, it usually is meant in one of two ways: first, it refers to God the Creator and Father whose name as given to Moses was YHVH, but was known in earlier times as El or El Shaddai. Second it is at times used to refer to the Godhead that consists of all that YHVH is.

In several places of the Gospels we find Yeshua as subservient to YHVH the Father; praying to YHVH the Father, asking YHVH the Father that the Father's will be done, showing us in the prayer Yeshua taught us. Yeshua taught us to pray "Our Father, who is in Heaven, Holy is Thy Name". Yeshua showed us that God YHVH is the Father, The Holy one that we should pray to.

Yeshua never claimed to be the Father, but rather show us the Throne, the head of our house "Our Father", and even depicting YHVH the Father on the central throne in Heaven.

With Yeshua we find him at his righteous place sitting to the right hand of The Father. YHVH our Father in The Kingdom of Heaven is the Mighty King and God. The Son is the Prince of Peace because He restores every broken relationship, provides a well-ordered and balanced life, and offers the assurance of eternal life.

Without peace, the continuity of life would not be possible. That is why the Son of God, King of kings on earth has come into the world YHVH has created.

In verse 2 John speaks of himself as one "who bore witness to the Word of YHVH and to the testimony of Yeshua the Messiah." That is, as one of the original 12 disciples, John heard the Gospel directly from the lips of Yeshua. The Word of YHVH and Yeshua the Messiah are parallel terms in this instance as John in other places in his various books calls Yeshua "the Word".

This amazing promise that came to John from YHVH is that to be passed along to the readers and hearers of Revelation: we will be blessed!

Many read Revelation as the end and often so misunderstood not seeing the Grace and Mercy YHVH has towards those who loves Him. Even further to this,YHVH made way that even those not knowing Him to come to Salvation.

The Book of Revelation is to bring us into transformation and obbedience. The blessings are given to us through God our Heavenly Father. YHVH said He will bless those who bless you, and curse those who curse you. YHVH wants us to not only see His blessings but to experience it. YHVH prepared a in advance a place for us. May the love of YHVH be a Revelation and help you to see His Grace is sufficient.
